Disclaimer:
 This map represents known blackside dace populations in Whitley County as of September 2009 and is not meant to represent every stream in which the species may occur in. The blackside dace is known to occur in streams throughout much of the Upper Cumberland River watershed above Cumberland Falls. A few disjunct populations are also known from the North Fork Powell River watershed (Lee Co., VA) and Staunton Creek watershed, Clinch River system (Scott Co., VA).

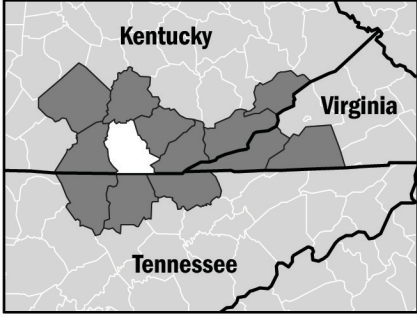
Blackside dace maps will be updated annually in the fall. Updates will be available on the Kentucky Master Logger Program website for updates - www.masterlogger.org.
