

AIR QUALITY PERMIT NOTICE

Draft Title V Permit V-20-026 R4

Toyota Motor Manufacturing, Kentucky, Inc. has applied to the Kentucky Division for Air Quality for a significant revision to the permit to operate an automobile manufacturing facility at 1001 Cherry Blossom Way, Georgetown, KY 40324. The plant is classified as a Title V major source due to its emissions of non-hazardous regulated air pollutants and hazardous air pollutants. Construction authorized by this permit will increase potential emissions of CO by 78.4 tons per year, NO_x by 34.7 tons per year, Particulate Matter (PM) by 62.1 tons per year, and Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) by 488 tons per year. The paint line #2 replacement project results in an increase in emissions of VOC by 34.92 tons per year, PM by 9.58 tons per year, NO_x by 33.24 tons per year, SO₂ by 0.54 tons per year and CO by 75.60 tons per year all of which are less than the significant emission rate to trigger further review under 401 KAR 51:017.

For a period of 30 days the Division is soliciting comments on the draft permit and affording the opportunity for a public hearing. The first day of the 30 day period is the day this notice is posted on the website above. Comments and/or public hearing requests should be sent to Michelle McCloskey at 300 Sower Boulevard, 2nd Floor, Frankfort, KY 40601 or via email to AIRKentucky@ky.gov. Any person who requests a public hearing must state the issues to be raised at the hearing. If the Division finds that a hearing will contribute to the decision-making process by clarifying significant issues affecting the draft permit, a hearing will be announced. All relevant comments will be considered in issuing the proposed permit. U.S. EPA has up to 45 days following issuance of the proposed permit to submit comments.
