

AIR QUALITY PERMIT NOTICE
Draft Title V Renewal Permit V-25-005

University of Kentucky of 225 Frank D. Peterson Service Bldg., Lexington, Kentucky 40506 has applied to the Kentucky Division for Air Quality for a renewal permit to operate a Colleges, Universities, and Professional Schools, (which includes the hospitals and clinics of the University of Kentucky and Samaritan Hospital) facility at 225 Frank D. Peterson Service Bldg., Lexington, Kentucky 40506. The plant is classified as a Title V major source due to its emissions of non-hazardous regulated air pollutants. The permit also includes a significant revision for a heating upgrade project to replace coal-fired boilers with natural gas fired boiler and an emergency generator. Construction authorized by this project causes an increase in emissions of 20.7 tpy of CO, 9.075 tpy of Nox, 4.62/4.62/4.62 tpy of PM/PM10/PM2.5, 3.02 tpy of VOC and 0.0014 tpy of SO2. The increase in emissions does not trigger further review under 401 KAR 51:001.

For a period of 30 days the Division is soliciting comments on the draft permit and affording the opportunity for a public hearing. The first day of the 30-day period is the day this notice is posted on the website above. Comments and/or public hearing requests should be sent to Michelle McCloskey at 300 Sower Boulevard, 2nd Floor, Frankfort, KY 40601 or via email to AIRKentucky@ky.gov. Any person who requests a public hearing must state the issues to be raised at the hearing. If the Division finds that a hearing will contribute to the decision-making process by clarifying significant issues affecting the draft permit, a hearing will be announced. All relevant comments will be considered in issuing the proposed permit. U.S. EPA has up to 45 days following issuance of the proposed permit to submit comments.
