## **Declaration of Nonfriable Removal**

<u>Instructions.</u> If you will be removing a nonfriable material in a manner which will not render the material friable, then you have a *nonfriable removal*. Examples of nonfriable materials which can often be kept nonfriable throughout removal and disposal are resilient floor coverings (linoleum, vinyl tile, etc.) and mastics, built-up roofs, asphalt shingles and pliable gaskets when these materials are in good condition prior to removal. Methods capable of keeping these materials nonfriable are based upon minimal disturbance (i.e., no grinding, abrading, pulverizing, crumbling or burning).
