## Tentative Decision to Renew a Hazardous Waste Operating Permit

The Kentucky Energy and Environment Cabinet (Cabinet), Division of Waste Management (Division), has tentatively approved the hazardous waste permit renewal for Rohm and Haas Chemicals LLC – Louisville Plant. The renewal is for an existing hazardous waste permit to store and treat hazardous waste at the facility located at 4300 Campground Road in Louisville, KY. This renewal is for hazardous waste storage and treatment and includes existing permitted container storage, operation of hazardous waste storage tanks, the operation of a boiler industrial furnace (BIF) used to treat hazardous waste, and requirements for corrective action related to the facility's Solid Waste Management Units (SWMUs) and Areas of Concern (AOCs). The requirements to control organic air emissions from hazardous waste treatment and storage units as well as associated ancillary equipment, which previously were included in a permit issued by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region IV, have been added to this permit as Kentucky has now been delegated authority for this program.

Rohm and Haas LLC is the owner of the permitted facility. The facility contact is Elaine Mink, Environmental Specialist (502-449-5291). The facility's address is 4300 Campground Road, Louisville, Kentucky 40216.

#### What will be done and why?

The hazardous waste regulations require that the issuance of hazardous waste permits or modifications include a thorough review of all required information to ensure that all program requirements are met, and that all interested parties have an opportunity to review and comment upon the proposed actions. The Division has completed a review of the respective permit applications and has prepared a draft Permit. The Division has determined that the applications meet the requirements set forth in the regulations, and that operation of the facilities in accordance with the requirements of the Permit will not pose an unreasonable risk to human health or the environment. The permit renewal includes detailed conditions required under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) and the Commonwealth of Kentucky statutes and regulations to ensure protectiveness of human health and the environment. A fact sheet with more information about the proposed modifications is available upon request.

#### How can I tell the Division what I think about this tentative approval?

Public involvement is encouraged and comments are welcome. Anyone wishing to comment on the tentative decision to approve these permitting actions should submit comments on or before **April 15, 2021**, the close of the public comment period. All comments received by the close of the public comment period noted above will be considered when making a final decision on the proposed permit renewal. Anyone submitting comments will be sent a "response to public comments" document specifying any changes made or not made, with the reasons why, as a result of the comment(s) submitted. Any person who may be aggrieved by the final decision on these proposed permit modifications may file with the cabinet a petition which sets forth the grounds of the objection and demand a hearing pursuant to KRS 224.10-420(2).
