





Energy and Environment Cabinet Promotes Spring Cleanup Events

March 22-28, 2020, marks the 22nd anniversary of Commonwealth Cleanup Week. Commonwealth Cleanup Week is an annual week-long event implemented by the Energy and Environment Cabinet (EEC) and also kicks off the Great American Cleanup, a National event that spans from March to June, with both events serving as a lead in to Earth Day activities in April. Its purpose is to provide Kentucky communities with an opportunity to "spring clean," recycle and promote personal responsibility across the Commonwealth.

Who is involved – The EEC, county solid waste coordinators and city officials, along with the Governor's Office, legislators, volunteer organizations and other state government entities promote and are supportive of Commonwealth Cleanup Week and associated events. <u>Eastern Kentucky PRIDE</u>, <u>Kentucky Transportation Cabinet</u>, <u>Bluegrass Greensource</u> and <u>Keep America Beautiful</u> are some of the entities that sponsor specific cleanup events at this time of year.

What – Statewide cleanup and recycling event mandated by the 1998 Kentucky General Assembly to promote responsible solid waste practices

Where - Throughout the Commonwealth

When – Commonwealth Cleanup Week – March 22-28 Great American Cleanup – March 19 through June 20 Earth Day – April 22

Prizes! – Civic, religious and nonprofit organizations can enter to win six separate \$100 prizes in a random drawing. To be eligible, organizations must register through their local solid waste coordinator and complete a cleanup project near the week of March 22-28, 2020. We Need Law Enforcement Support!

The cabinet asks all law enforcement officials to step up efforts to cite for criminal littering and illegal dumping during the cleanups. We also request that county attorneys and district judges follow through with prosecution of littering and dumping citations during that time. Some useful laws for issuing citations are: KRS 433.757 (Littering Public Waters) and KRS 433.753 (Criminal Littering on Public Highway.)
