Conservation Checklist

Practice water saving this year by taking the Kentucky Water Hero pledge at bit.ly/H2OHEROES. To uphold that pledge, check out these simple steps each month to save water.



I will learn how much water my home uses each month and find new ways to save water.



If I am looking for a new home, I will look for a WaterSense labeled model that is more water efficient.



I will upgrade the look of my bathroom and decrease my water use with new WaterSense labeled fixtures.



I will check my water meter before and after a two-hour period to see if my home has leaks.



I will upgrade my irrigation system with a WaterSense labelled controller to only water my landscape when needed.



I will choose the right plants for my landscape that are native to my area and drought-tolerant.



I will group my new plants together by watering needs in hydrozones to avoid over- and under-watering.



With the arrival of summer, I'll find an irrigation pro certified by a WaterSense labeled program to maximize outdoor savings.



During the summer I will water my landscape wisely in the morning or evening when temperatures are cooler.



I will water smarter by trying the cycle-and-soak method to avoid overwatering.



I will be a H2erO this drought season and follow any watering restrictions in my area.



If I live in an apartment, condo, or dorm, I will follow these tips to help out in a drought.



I will add saving water to my morning routine by turning off the tap while I brush my teeth.



I will Shower Better by replacing my old showerhead with a WaterSense labeled model.



For Energy Awareness Month, I will save the energy used to heat water by taking shorter showers.



I will only run my dishwasher when it is full and scrape leftover food into the trash instead of using the garbage disposal.



I will test my toilet for leaks and install a new flapper if needed.



If I need a new toilet, I will install a WaterSense labeled model.



I will use the Fix a Leak Week Checklist to chase down leaks in my home.
