Call to Order and Introduction: Mr. Danny Shipley

SWCC Minutes from the September 16, 2024, Meeting: A motion to approve the meeting minutes was made by Mr. Bill Harned. Mr. Keith Tingle seconded the motion. **Motion carried**.

Agency Reports

- <u>Division of Conservation</u>: Mr. Jay Nelson discussed the following:
 - Attended the Lower Cumberland RC&D meeting to discuss stream bank erosion.
 - DOC employees attended the NASCA meeting in October.
 - Mr. Jay Nelson complemented Ms. Kimberly Bartley on her presentation to the entire conference.
 - Mr. Nelson did a presentation for the Division of Water at their field staff meeting.
 - o Discussed the DOC all hands staff meeting in Bowling Green in October.
 - Meeting with Ms. Crystal Renfro dealing with Envirothon.
 - Mr. Jay Nelson informed the Commission that the State Cost Share Program is down 200 applications this year from last year.
 - Discussed the progress of the Red Lick Water Conservancy District.
 - Their first meeting to be held on December 2nd.
- <u>Division of Forestry</u>: Mr. Gordon Slone discussed the following:
 - Discussed invasive plants and species and possible legislation (specifically on Bradford pear tree).

- Since September, the Division of Forestry has suppressed a total of 261 fires that burned a total of 10,355 acres.
- In October, the Division assisted with a tree giveaway in Mayfield and Dawson Springs, which resulted in 690 trees disturbed.
- The nurseries have sold 444,990 seedlings so far this year.
- FY24 Completed 343 Stewardship Plans and 2,552 acres for practice plans.
- <u>Natural Resources Conservation Service</u>: Mr. Steve Beam discussed the following:
 - Previous year was the largest for EQIP and CSP in history of the Commonwealth. All money was obligated and there was an increase in IRA funds. There were 7 RCPP proposals this year and 2 were approved.
- <u>Farm Service Agency</u>: Not attended.
- <u>Department for Natural Resources</u>: Mr. Gordon Sloan discussed the following:
 - \circ $\,$ In 2022 DNR received \$25 million from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.
 - 635 orphaned wells plugged.
 - Update on 2024 funding update.
 - Methane Emissions Reduction Program update.
 - Kentucky Abandoned Storage Tank and Orphan Well Program: \$500,000 in funds each year.
 - AML grant in the amount of \$74.25 million in funding for the next 15 years.
- <u>Kentucky Department of Agriculture</u>: Ms. Johnna McHugh presented the following:
 - On November 15th the Kentucky AG Development Board approved the 2025 program guidelines and should be finalized by December 1st.
 - KDP increase the administrative expenses from 5% to 6% for KDA's cost share programs.
- <u>University of Kentucky, CAFE</u>: Not attended.
- <u>KACD</u>: Ms. Crystal Renfro discussed the following:
 - KACD legislative priorities have been set for next year.
 - Included are increasing the limit for special audits, state cost share, direct aid, and watershed dam rehab funds.
 - Legislative reception will be held on February 4, 2025, in Frankfort Kentucky.
 - Meeting with Mr. Jay Nelson and Ms. Johnna McHugh discussing Envirothon.
 - Art and Writing contest: Awards Reception to be held on March 7th in Frankfort in the rotunda at the Capital.
 - Getting closer to hiring a new Public Affairs Specialist for KACD.
 - KACD's 75/25 partnership with NRCS (partnership employee agreement). The new program will be at the rate of 80/20%.
 - Upcoming NACD meeting to be held August 2nd through August 5th.
 - KACD committees are reforming. There will be legislative, natural resources, and education/youth committees.

- <u>KACDE</u>: Ms. Penny Warwick discussed the following:
 - KACDE Southeast Conference in Pigeon Forge with 27 people from Kentucky attending.

SWCC Correspondence: Mr. Jay Nelson discussed the following:

- Barren County requested reconsideration for the disbursement of Direct Aid funds. A motion to approve was made by Mr. Jeff Rice and was seconded by Mr. Don Overbey. **Motion denied**.
- Carter County requested Environmental Grant unused funds for heavy use area installation be moved to their chemical program under the same grant. A motion to approve was made by Mr. Keith Tingle and was seconded by Ms. Denise Hoffman. **Motion carried**.
- Morgan County informed the Commission the loan for the purchase of equipment is no longer needed at this time.
- Owsley County is requesting an additional \$1,500.00 in Direct Aid Funding. A correction on Owsley County's Annual Report was made. A motion to approve was made by Mr. Bill Harned and was seconded by Mr. Keith Tingle. **Motion carried**.
- Taylor County would like to move the \$1,500 left in the Environmental Grant funding to the dead animal removal category. A motion to approve was made by Ms. Denise Hoffman and was seconded by Mr. Bill Harned. **Motion carried**.
