The Kentucky Division of Abandoned Mine Lands (DAML) facilitates the distribution of federal funded AMLER Grants. These grants are geared toward economic and community development with correlation to historic, AML eligible, mine sites. **DAML anticipates additional funding to be made available in 2024.**
