Drillers Annual Training Requirement

If you are not using the Kentucky Ground Water Association's annual workshop for your annual training requirement, you may use other approved training. To insure that the training you plan on using for your 3-hour annual training requirement will be accepted, you will need to get **prior approval** from the Groundwater Branch. The following information must be submitted:

- 1. Obtain an agenda/ syllabus of the training subject(s) to be presented. Also include the date of the training and the number of class hours for each subject.
- 2. Mail, fax, or call in the information outlined above to the Groundwater Branch for **pre-approval**. The point-of-contact at Groundwater Branch is Joe Moffitt (502-564-3410 extension 597).
- 3. When you complete the training, obtain a certificate or a signed document of attendance listing the hours and subject of the class.
- 4. Send the documentation of your training with your driller renewal application to the Groundwater Branch.
- 5. If you receive more than three hours of approved training in one year, you can carry over up to three hours of approved training to the following year.
